CLUB SPONSORED CCW CLASS at the VSA clubhouse!! The CCW class is scheduled for Monday and Tuesday, MAY 1st and May 2nd, 5pm to 9pm. Next month's class is scheduled for June 5th & 6th.

As part of your VSA membership, the once-a-month CCW classes at the clubhouse are FREE! You do not have to call first, just have proof of your VSA membership in good standing (yellow receipt or membership card). Membership applications, renewals, or membership payments will not be accepted at the class.

Wade Roberts will normally hold the CCW class at the clubhouse <u>the first Monday AND Tuesday of each month</u>, 5PM to 9PM. Non-members incur a fee of \$80 for an initial permit class (8 hours) and \$40 for a renewal class (4 hours). Renewal classes can be attended on either Monday or Tuesday, and initial CCW application classes can be attended across months – Monday one month, and Tuesday the next month, for example.

Everyone attending the class will also have to qualify with their permit pistols by shooting at the range. Non-members will incur a range use fee of \$20, while members have range privileges already. You must qualify with each pistol on your permit. If you cannot qualify on the designated day, non-members pay a \$20 range fee and a \$20 qualification fee, while VSA members pay a \$10 qualification fee.

The CCW Instruction and Qualification certificates are good for six months for initial application or renewal, so you can plan ahead and have plenty of time. Don't wait, get your CCW or renew it! Ladder safety tips from Grainger.com – (edited for space and content, not comprehensive) Statistics from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) indicate that 43% of fatal falls in the last decade involved a ladder, and an estimated 81% of construction workers' fall injuries treated in U.S. emergency departments involve a ladder, according to Industrial Safety and Hygiene News (ISHN).

- * **Download a ladder safety app.** The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) has <u>a ladder safety app for mobile devices</u> that features a multimodal indicator and a graphic-oriented guide for ladder selection, inspection, positioning, accessorizing and safety use.
- * Create a ladder safety checklist to review before each use.
- * Conduct regular inspections to ensure ladders are in good condition. Problems like bent and broken steps can be hazardous. OSHA mandates that ladders be inspected for visible defects before their first use in a work shift.
- * Teach proper ladder-climbing skills. Use the American Ladder Institute (ALI) three-point-of-contact climb to reduce slips and falls. The ALI recommends that the climber face the ladder when going both up and down. The climber should have three points of contact with the ladder at all times—either two hands and one foot, or two feet and one hand.
- * Teach the Four-to-One rule. What is the correct angle for a ladder? The four-to-one rule can help you get the angle right. According the <u>California Department of Industrial Relations</u>, a ladder should be positioned one foot out for every four feet up. For example, if a ladder is leaning against the top of a 20-foot wall, the base should be five feet away from the wall.



In addition: *Get the Right-Sized Ladder for the Job. Duty rating is important as well, so be sure to pick the right ladder for your workload and weight. *Stay Within Your Reach. When working from a ladder, keep your center of gravity and body between the side rails. If you can't easily reach the project area once you have ascended the ladder, climb down and move the ladder more closely in alignment. *Take Your Time Climbing Down—Don't Skip Any Steps.
