Any fans of the old British show "Monty Python"? And now for something completely different....

The following was adapted from the magazine *Cook's Country*, Feb/Mar 2024. "The Best Rolling Pins", page 42. Testers tried out three styles of rolling pins – handled pins, dowels, and tapered pins (also called French pins) – made of a variety of different materials. Testers did not like any of the handled pins. They found it easier to assess a dough's thickness and how hard to press when using a dowel or tapered pin.

They found that having a dowel pin with a length and weight evenly distributed, it was easy to roll out wide, long doughs, perfect for croissants and slab pies. A tapered pin is lighter and thinner and offers finer control (look for a tapered pin with a fairly significant center flat surface).

What to look for: Wood Pins – Wood pins were efficient as well as easy to use. The slightly rough surface of wood held a fine dusting of flour, making them virtually nonstick. The textured surface gripped the dough, casing the dough to be responsive to the desired movements. Look for a **weight** of 1 to 1 ½ pounds, just right for rolling but not too uncomfortable to use or to crush the dough underneath. A **long barrel** about 19" – 20".

What to avoid: Short pins - They left unwanted indents at their edges when pressed into the dough. Short pins also can overwork the dough, causing it to be tough, rather than light and flaky. Avoid **dramatically tapered pins**. They left unwanted indents in the dough and required more work to get an evenly flat dough.

Marble pins were found to be too heavy and cumbersome. Stainless steel pins warmed up during hand use, which can warm up the dough as well and result in tough, dense pastries. Marble, stainless steel, and plastic models were too smooth to hold a dusting of flour and stuck to pie dough as a result.
